What Are Honors Classes?

- Honors curriculum is designed to challenge students with a richer, more rigorous curriculum.
- Honors classes are rigorous academically challenging classes in preparation for advanced high school classes.
- Honors classes focus on higher level thinking skills according to Blooms and Marzano Taxonomy.
- Honors classes are designed to differentiate for students that have demonstrated academic success by test/assessment scores to be academically ready for a more rigorous curriculum compared to other core classes.

What Makes Honors Classes Different From Other Classes?

- Honors classes are different from other core classes in presentation, assignments, formative assessments, and summative assessments.
- Honors classes provide students the knowledge, concepts, and skills needed to engage in higher level of learning.
- Honors classes follow district curriculum framework; however, the enhanced curriculum provides for the differentiation in the level of analysis and utilization of information.
